MESSAGE FROM PRESIDENT LINDA SPIRO

It was great to see around 80 people at the September meeting! The room was buzzing with people getting a chance to reconnect with old friends they hadn't seen in a while. The October meeting promises to be exciting too since Tiel Rainelli from the Women's Storybook Project will discuss recording incarcerated mothers reading books to their children with the recording and books then sent to the children. (Thanks to those who donated books and money to buy books for this project!) Also at the October meeting, considering all the shootings in the news, I asked HARTA members Trilla Cook, Safety Chair, and Tom Duffey, the former Humble ISD Assistant Maintenance Director, to provide a brief article (Trilla) and an in-person update (Tom) on safety procedures/building safety.

Also exhilarating are the fun HARTA trips which are always described in the newsletters. Until I started organizing some of the trips, I didn't know about certain Precinct 3 rules regarding riding the free buses they provide us. For example, if you ride to a site on the bus, you must also ride back on the bus. Riders must be at least 50 years old unless they are a caregiver of a special needs passenger or the spouse of someone over 50 or an adult special needs child over the age of 18 traveling with a parent. (Call 832-927-6820 or email transportation@pct3.hctx.net to request an exception to the age requirement.) If a couple is traveling together, they must use a third person not on the bus as their emergency contact.

Humble ISD Strengthens School Safety with State-Mandated Protocols

In response to statewide requirements to enhance school security, Humble ISD has expanded its safety measures to protect students and staff against intruders or active shooter threats

Texas law now requires every school district to maintain a Multihazard Emergency Operations Plan (EOP) that includes specific protocols for active-shooter situations. Districts must also undergo safety audits every three years, ensure standardized terminology during emergencies (such as Hold, Secure, Lockdown, Evacuate), and implement trauma-informed safety drills.

Through the Texas School Safety Center, schools follow the Standard Response Protocol (SRP) system, which unifies communication between educators, students, and law enforcement during emergencies. Recent legislation also requires districts to install silent panic alert systems and maintain an armed security presence at each campus. Humble ISD has gone further by:

- Establishing a Safe & Secure Schools program with a districtwide Emergency Operations Plan.
- Using clear action terms such as Hold (remain in class-rooms) and Secure the Perimeter (lock outside doors).
- Providing a safety hotline and iHELP app for students, staff, and parents to report concerns.

- Equipping staff in some schools with ballistic shields as an additional protective measure.
- Partnering with law enforcement for coordinated response drills and crisis planning.

Humble ISD has installed an Al-powered weapons detection system in its six high schools. There were some delays and long lines during the initial entry process, but those issues reportedly improved after a few days.

- The system is designed to detect weapons while allowing students to carry normal personal items (laptops, umbrellas, etc.) without triggering false alarms.
- At Turner Stadium (used for athletic events) there is a weapon detection system at both the Home and Visitor entrances, along with a clear-bag policy. That system is called Evolv Express.

All those registered to vote by October 6 are eligible to vote in the November elections. I recommend going to your county clerk's website (in Harris County that is www.harrisvotes.com) to see what will be on your ballot. All of us will find sixteen proposed amendments to our state constitution, eight of which bear on property taxes, education, or both. Some local jurisdictions, such as cities and school districts, may also have elections on that same ballot. To be an informed voter, check to see what will be on the ballot where you live and vote. Early voting will be available between October 20 and October 31. Last chance is Tuesday, November 4. Turnout for such elections is usually very low, sometimes fewer than ten percent of registered voters. We can lament that, but we can also know that we who do show up really count!



TREASURER'S CORNER

As of September 22, 2025, HARTA has a balance of \$23,951.89 in the Business Checking Account at PNC Bank.

The Certificate of Deposit held at PNC Bank earned \$33.68 in interest in September and now has a balance of \$10,125.49.

The Endowed Fund with the Humble ISD Education Foundation had a balance of \$36,702 at the end of the second quarter of 2025 (June 30, 2025). That balance does not reflect a deposit of \$3000 for student scholarships for 2025-26 nor a transfer of \$2100 from the Endowed Fund to the Humble ISD Education Foundation to reimburse the foundation for Educator Grants for 2024-25.

A big thanks to those who have paid their TRTA and HARTA dues for 2025-26. For those who haven't paid your TRTA and HARTA dues, you may find it easier to pay your TRTA (\$35) and HARTA (\$10) dues at the same time with one payment of \$45 to HARTA. When you do so, you will be paid through June 30, 2026.

If you don't receive a monthly annuity from the Teacher Retirement System (TRS), you may still participate in meetings and HARTA trips and tours by either joining TRTA and HARTA as a non-annuitant or making an annual donation of at least \$10 to HARTA. Our non-annuitant members and donors are an important part of HARTA.


