### Keep your blood pressure down during the holidays!

- 1. Older adults should keep salt intake under 1500 mg a day.

## **Staying Safe During the Holidays**

The holiday season is a time for joy, family, and celebration—but it's also a time when accidents and scams tend to increase. By taking a few precautions, you can help keep your home and loved ones safe this season.

## 1. Preventing Physical Falls

Holiday decorating often involves ladders, cords, and cluttered spaces. Always use a sturdy ladder and have someone nearby holding the ladder when hanging lights or decorations. Keep walkways clear of cords, boxes, and rugs that could cause trips or slips. If weather conditions are icy or wet, wear shoes with good traction and spread salt or sand on outdoor steps and driveways.

After the gifts are opened, be mindful of wrapping paper, ribbons, and gift bags scattered on the floor. These can easily become slip or trip hazards—especially for children, pets, and older adults. Collect and dispose of wrapping materials promptly, and keep gift bags and boxes out of high-traffic areas.

## 2. Avoiding Internet Scams

Online shopping peaks during the holidays, and so do cyber scams. Be cautious of emails or texts offering deals that sound "too good to be true." Shop only on secure

websites (look for "https" in the web address) and avoid using public Wi-Fi to make purchases. Never share personal or financial information through email or social media messages, and monitor your bank accounts regularly for unauthorized charges.

### 3. Cooking and Kitchen Safety

Holiday meals bring everyone together, but cooking fires are one of the leading causes of home fires during this season. Never leave cooking food unattended, and keep flammable items—like towels or oven mitts—away from the stove. Use timers to remind you when cooking times for recipes are done, and turn pot handles inward to avoid spills. Keep a fire extinguisher nearby and make sure smoke detectors are working properly.

By taking a few extra steps to prevent falls, avoid online scams, and cook carefully, you can ensure your holidays are filled with warmth and cheer—not unexpected emergencies. Stay safe, stay aware, and enjoy the season.

The Christmas/New Year's holiday season is punctuated by politicians announcing their candidacies for offices ranging from Justice of the Peace to U. S. Senator in the coming year's elections. Filing for the 2026 Republican and Democratic primary elections is open until December 8.

Even before the March primaries, special elections will fill vacancies in a U. S. House seat last held by Representative Sylvester Turner and a Texas Senate seat last held by Senator Brandon Creighton.

If you or any family members have moved and need to update voter registrations, that needs to happen at least thirty days before any election in which you need to vote. Use every opportunity you have to question candidates about issues important to you, including but not limited to those related to education and retirement.



## October Meeting Centerpieces. -Brenda Pearson

I really enjoyed making the October HARTA meeting centerpieces that became door prizes for some members. If you still have your pumpkin, you might be interested in a few details. The natural elements came from these sources: the Spanish moss from my property on the Trinity River; the acorns from the ground below the oak trees on the east side of the Kingwood Community Center; the succulents from Kingwood Garden Club member Alan Raymond; the pumpkins from the produce section of Krogers on Hwy 59; and everything else from local craft stores. The succulent on each pumpkin is living, and some water should be placed on the green moss that holds it in place about twice a month. The pumpkins should last for a long time, but eventually they will start to deteriorate. I suggest keeping the pumpkin on a dish that would catch any liquid that might leak out. The top of the pumpkin can then be carefully sliced off and placed onto a bed of soil in a shallow container. Or, the succulent can be removed and transplanted. The other decorations on the top can be repurposed. The pumpkin stem should surely be saved in an open-air bag for use in making a velveteen pumpkin. I would love to hear how long your pumpkin lasts.
