#### HARTA REPORT FOR BOOK PROJECT JUNE AND JULY

As of July 29, 2025 we have distributed 10,615 books. Our total for May was 6,744. We have since distributed 2,000 books to four Humble ISD schools for their summer school programs, 1,079 at the July 4<sup>th</sup> book giveaway at Town Center, 600 books to Magdalene House Social Services, 106 books to neighborhood mini-libraries, 80 books to the Creativity Shell, 6 as gifts to family, and 1,173 on August 2 at HEB. Thank you for donating books and your time to make this program work.

INFORMATION AND PROTECTIVE SERVICES

Since HARTA Safety Chair, Virginia Cowan, recently fell and broke her arm when getting off a treadmill, here is an AI summary from several sources about preventing falls. HARTA sends prayers and best wishes for a speedy recovery to Virginia.

To prevent falls, it's crucial to make your environment safer, improve your physical health, and be mindful of your surroundings. This includes removing hazards at home, staying active, exercising and ensuring you have proper footwear and assistive devices if needed.

#### **Home Safety:**

- Remove tripping hazards: Clear clutter, loose rugs, and cords from walkways.
- Improve lighting: Ensure adequate lighting, especially on stairs and in hallways.
- **Install grab bars and handrails:** Add grab bars in bathrooms and handrails on staircases.
- **Use non-slip mats:** Use non-slip mats in the bathroom and shower.
- **Secure rugs:** Secure loose rugs with double-sided tape or remove them entirely.
- **Keep frequently used items within reach:** Store items in easily accessible locations to avoid reaching or stretching. **Physical Health:**
- **Stay active:** Engage in regular physical activity, focusing on exercises that improve balance and strength, such as Tai Chi or walking.
- Maintain good vision and hearing: Get regular eye and hearing exams, as poor vision and hearing can affect balance.
- Manage medications: Be aware of potential side effects of medications that could affect balance and consult your doctor if needed.
- Stay hydrated and eat well: Proper nutrition and hydration are important for overall health and can prevent lightheadedness or fainting.

TREASURER'S CORNER

As of July 28, 2025, HARTA has a balance of \$22,359.84 in the Business Checking Account at PNC Bank.

The Certificate of Deposit held at PNC Bank earned \$94.49 in interest in May, June and July and now has a balance of \$10,058.24

The Endowed Fund with the Humble ISD Education Foundation had a balance of \$36,702 at the end of the second quarter of 2025 (June 30, 2025). That balance does not reflect a deposit of \$3000 for students scholarships for 2025-26 nor a transfer of \$2100 from the Endowed Fund to the Humble ISD Education Foundation to reimburse the foundation for Educator Grants for 2024-25.

Just a reminder that TRTA and HARTA dues for 2025-26 are now payable. You may find it easier to pay your TRTA (\$35) and HARTA (\$10) dues at the same time with one payment of \$45. When I receive your TRTA payment I will enter your name and directory information into the TRTA portal and you will be paid through June 30, 2026.

LEGISLATIVE NEWS

Governor Abbott has called a special session of the Texas Legislature which convened Monday, July 21. While the Governor can add topics to the "call" any time, so far none relates directly to Teacher Retirement. However, several items do relate to education:

One proposes to replace the STAAR test.

Another further limits the spending power of local governments, including school districts.

A third limits the ability of local governments, including school districts, to lobby the Legislature on matters affecting them.

In its regular session, the Legislature proposed 17 amendments to our state Constitution. We will vote on them November 4. The following propositions will affect education in some way:

Proposition 1 creates a workforce education fund.

Propositions 7, 9, 10, 11, 13, and 17 all limit the ability of local governments (including school districts) to assess property taxes but do not guarantee that the state will replace any lost revenue from state funds.

Proposition 15 affirms that parents are the primary decision-makers for their children.

TRTA Executive Director Tim Lee regularly, usually weekly, e-mails on issues which concern our retirement. Always read those and be ready to contact your legislators about current issues that matter to you.


We all know of the flood in the hill country. Your Foundation Disaster Relief provided \$500 financial assistance for emergency expenses to TRTA members.
